

Throughout his career, his teams won two SEC championships, five SEC division titles, and one ACC division title. He was a two-time SEC Coach of the Year (2002, 2005), the 2017 ACC Coach of the Year, and the recipient of the national 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year Award.

In his book, "Make the Call," Coach Richt shares his greatest football memories and pivotal life moments in hopes of guiding readers to make crucial, game-time decisions in their own lives.
